The Pastor's Pen

One of the things that brings me joy is the small wall of crosses in my study. I once heard a pastor friend of mine explain how he did not believe that we should have walls of crosses because he thought that making something beautiful in our homes or workspaces with the element of Christ's torture degrades its meaning. While I hear his point, it is one I struggle accepting.

Yes, the cross was a brutal device employed by the Roman Empire to bring humiliation and defeat to the people who were crucified, the families of those individuals, and even to the surrounding communities. The cross was and is an ugly instrument for death, and Christ died on it *for us*; there are few other methods we see through history that so cruelly shamed a person as they died.

Yet the cross, despite its ugliness, is also a place that Christians can look to for a beauty that far surpasses all the ugliness, nastiness, and sin of

the human condition. The cross—especially because of what Christ did on it—can remind us of beauty beyond ugliness, even as it symbolizes our faith and our belief that there is life beyond death, because of God's love poured out through the empty tomb of Easter.

Each of these crosses in my study have a story that goes with them. Some I have picked up on my travels around the world. Some I have purchased here in Statesville. Others have been gifted to me when my family or friends have traveled and saw one they felt I would like to have. They are handmade. Some are store bought. Some are as natural as creation. A few of them have been made by the hands of some I've known who have died and completed their baptisms in the Lord. Some by children. Most have been crafted by strangers whose names I'll never know. Nevertheless, each cross has been made by a child of God, and in this I find beauty in the

variety of stories and cultures that make this wall of story.

And when I look to them, I remember that Christ died for us all—no matter who we are, irregardless of what our physical or mental condition is, and indifferent how our social appreciations may be. Christ made the cross beautiful because this is the place where love to the earth was given forever, and anytime I feel down, I just remember that each of these crosses bears witness to the love God gives humanity and about the love that is within the story of each.

I think it's worth finding beauty wherever we can, most especially the cross that redeems us.

I invite you—whether I am in the study or not—to come in sometime to see them (and if I'm present, ask me about their stories... some of them are great.)

God loves you, and so do I.

The members of the Centennial Sub-Committee continue to do their work to determine the physical layout and design of our worship space. They most recently met on Monday, 12 June to continue their lengthy discussions and deliberations.

At present, the members are confident in the need to repair the plaster, paint the walls, install new lighting options, and refurbish the pews. Still in conversation is new carpeting and options for flooring, though a directions supports simply installing new carpet. Pew cushions continue to be discussed (color and style).

As part of June's attempt to solicit your input regarding a centralized pulpit, the leaders of the sub-committee thank you for your input and opinions, which they will bring to the members for their discernment.

As always, if you have questions about the process we are undergoing or would like to discuss this matter, you are welcome to speak with co-chairs, Donnie Haynes or Jane Lentz. 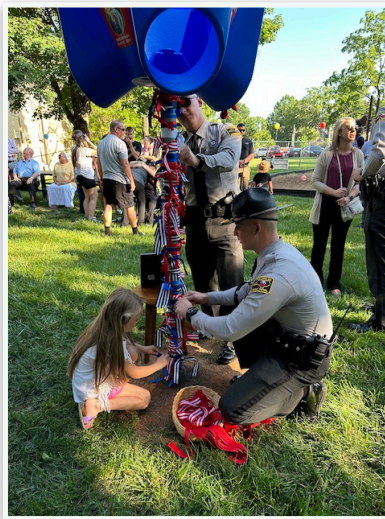




O Holy God of Comfort and Mercy,

We come to you acknowledging the bittersweetness of this day—knowing that a year ago, you called to your peace Bentley and Michael. We pray for them and for Jada, who followed your summons days later, and we ask you to continue shining light upon their souls and love upon the memories we have of them. We lament the tragedies of this world that cause families to be torn apart well before we are ever ready for such events, yet in our unknowing and lack of understanding, we have faith in your will and time set for each of us.

This evening, perhaps the healing wounds of one year ago feel fresh again to us and our hearts may feel trouble as we seek to sort questions that may never find response, yet we—this family and community—give glory and praise to you that you have given us examples of steadfast courage and determination in Amy—Bentley’s mom and Mike’s true love. We thank you for the smiling face of young Bailey, in whom each of us find the reflection of her “Bubba,” and we thank you that the moon in the night sky continues to reflect eternal and everlasting love into their lives.

In this playground, we stand here in witness to Bentley’s life, and we say, “Thank you, God. Thank you for giving us five short years with him to fill our lives with someone who enjoyed playing, making friends, sharing kindness, showing joy, and zipping through life with excitement.” We thank you, God, for this camaraderie of friends and teachers who gathers around this new piece of playground equipment in testimony to the young life we feel absent from us, and we pray for its dedication for this generation’s and future years of children’s enjoyment.

Perhaps somewhere with you in ways we cannot yet see, there is a little boy climbing around, throwing a ball, and swinging by spider webs throughout Heaven. Let him know we are strong and that his life and legacy means something to each of us. Let him know that we will enjoy this equipment, named in his memory. Let him know that every time a teddy bear is given or a flower enjoyed that his laughter will echo in our hearts. Let him know that his mother and sister are well, and that they are showing this entire city what determination to live—and to live fully—is all about.

For every person who prays with us now, pour your blessings upon them. Remind us, O God, that you are our fervent hope, even in seasons when hope feels lost. And bring us to the joy of life to be lived here, even as we journey to the time when we will live with you.

Bless the blue and the red strips of cloth—uniting them in the colors of Spiderman’s suit—to remind us that each time we watch them flutter in the breeze, it’s a sign of your Spirit blowing amongst us. Bless the white ribbon from Amy and Bailey, that they will see in its color the light of the moon and the presence of the little soul for whom we pray, now and forever. We pray to you in Jesus’s name and by your Spirit; Amen.
